

University Policies and Procedures

TAILGATING PROCEDURE S

These procedures implement Policy 100602 – Policy for Tailgating incorporate its definitions, and may be amended from time to time without the need to amend that policy.

I. Procedures

A. Rules and Management:

- All University policies and procedures long with local, state, and federal law, remain in effect and subject to enforcement while Tailgating occurs. This cludes but is not limite to the use of illicit drugs smoking, the distribution almsale of alcoholand underage consumption of aldrol.
- 2. The University may establish special rules, restrictions, or ategral specifically applicable to unique events or circumstantegs, (Homecoming, Family Weekend, Tigerfestc.) In such cases, the procedures remain in effect in addition to those additional rules, restrictions, or regulations established by the lensity.
- 3. The Athletics Department ("Athletics") manages tailgating events

B. Guidelines Expectations, and Prohibitions

- 1. These Procedures anticipate and require that all remember the University community, third parties and guests participating in Tailgating pursuant to the University Tailgating Policy, act in a responsible manner to ensure that everyone has a safe and enjoyable experienceln order to maximize the positive ture of the Tailgating experience, the University encourages respectful treatment, language and behavior towards others. The University does not and will not tolerate harassment, abusive or threatening behavior. Such behavior may be a violation of the Iniversity's antidiscrimination and harassment policythe Code of Student Conduct, as well as local, state and federalaw.
- 2. A Tailgating participant who violates University policy and procedure and/orany local, state, or fedal law or may be remover the University premises, incur fines, loss of parking and/or Tailgating privileges, and/or applicable disciplinary actionder the University's Code of Student Conducts well as possible criminal prosecution
- 3. The University permits ailgating in Designated Areas only and with appropriated vance approval. All Tailgating activities for DI, Tier 5 Sports clubs must be sponsored by an alumni or parent group.

- D. Requirements Related Adcoholic Beverages:
 - The University permits the consumption of Alcoholic Beverages defined by the Tailgating Policy, by those 21 or more years of age in Designated Areas only.
 - Possession of an Alcoholic Beverage is prohibited byforwa person under 21 years of age. It is also prohibited for a person under 21 years of age to purchase, comse, distribute, store, or transport Alcoholic Beverages.
 - 3. If you intend to drink alcohol, please designate a sober driver.
 - 4. The University permits the possession of an Open Container by someone 21 or more years of age while Tailgating in Designated Areas only. Designated Areas are defined in the Tailgating Policy. Possession of an Open Container outside of the Designated Tailing Areas is prohibited by state law and liversity policy. Adriver of a motor vehicle may be subject to criminal proseicum if any occupant in that motor vehicle possesses an Open Container.
 - 5. Alcohol by individuals who are 21 or more years of age is permitted in the Designated Tailgatingreas subject to reasonable consumption limits as set forth in Paragraph 6.
 - 6. The University prohibits beer kegs, pathalls, multiquart containers of any type of alcoholdrinking paraphernaliæ(g, funnels, beer bongs, ice lugesetc) and drinking gares of any sort during Tailgating(e.g. Beer Pong, Beer @[snappa], flip cup, slap cup, drinking corn hole, and drinking Kandh, etc).  - 7. Glass containers of any kind are strictly prohibited.
 - 8. Distribution, manufacturingsale, and underage consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
 - 9. The use of drug(medically prescribedor not) is strictly prohibited on university tailgating of ts.

E. Parking:

- 3. Keep roadways and access points clear at all times
- 4. Tailgating for those with General Admission tickets is located in parking lot(s) which are defined as Designated Areaisgating is prohibited in any other areas, including garages. The Unityer reserves the right to restrict vehicle entry or parking, as well as to preclude Tailgating in retain parking spaces or others areas
