

- 1) Apply online preferably *before* starting the course via the Online Portal:

- 2) Submit a copy of your program acceptance, the course syllabus, and the agreement form with your application.
- 3) Fulfill all the requirements of the accelerated graduate course.
- 4) Complete a research paper or project and an additional, reflective 5-page essay at the end of the semester.
- 5) Present a poster at the Honors Celebration of Scholarship and Learning event.
- 6) Note: Only 600-level, 700-level, and 800-level graduate courses (or above) will count. In addition, you may only use one accelerated graduate course for Honors EAL credit (3 units max.).

In order to earn Honors Experiential and Advanced Learning credit for an accelerated graduate course, the student and professor must review and sign this form. The student must submit this form with a copy of the program acceptance and the course syllabus via the Online Portal (see link above) by the end of that semester's change of schedule period. Credit will not be granted retroactively.
